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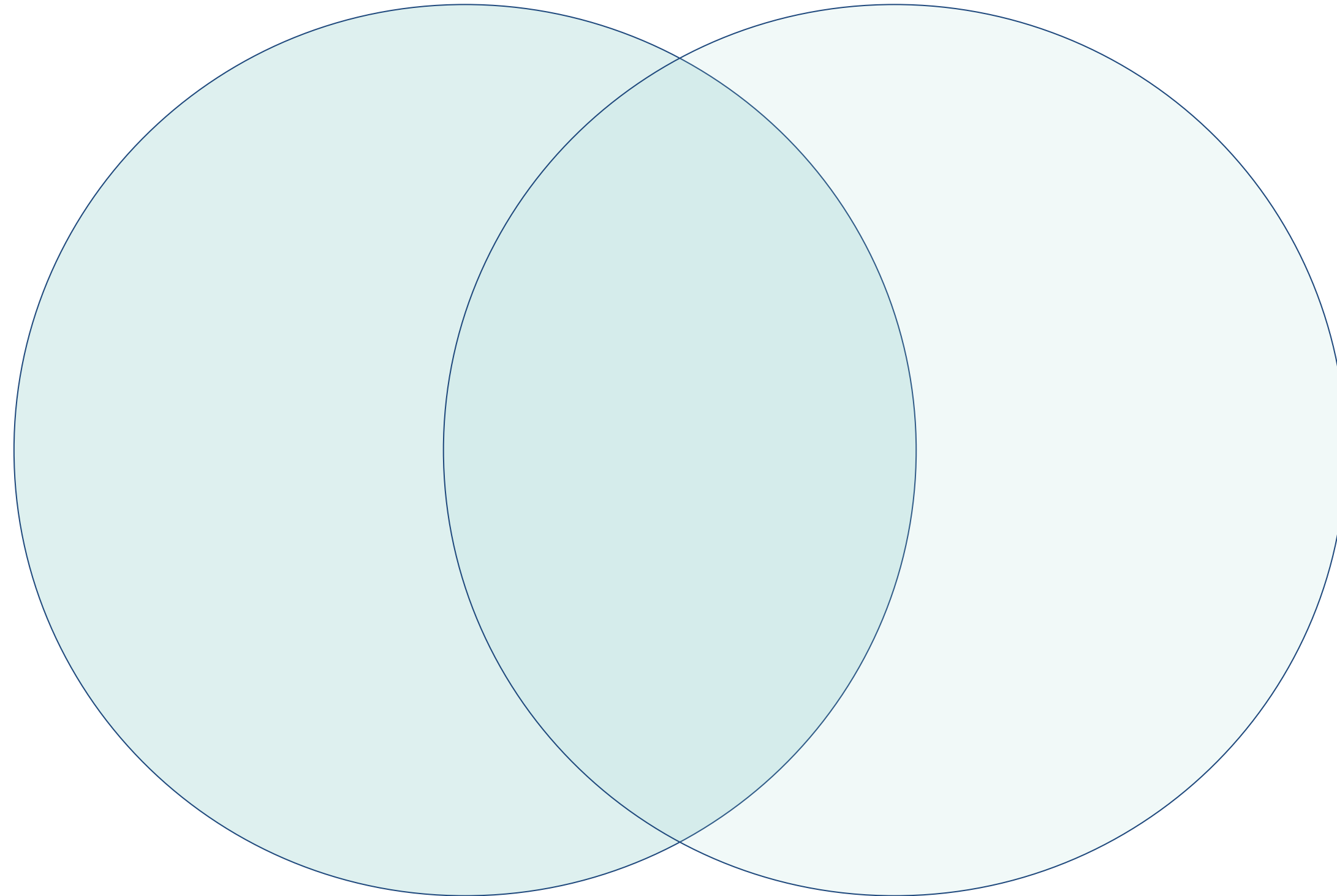


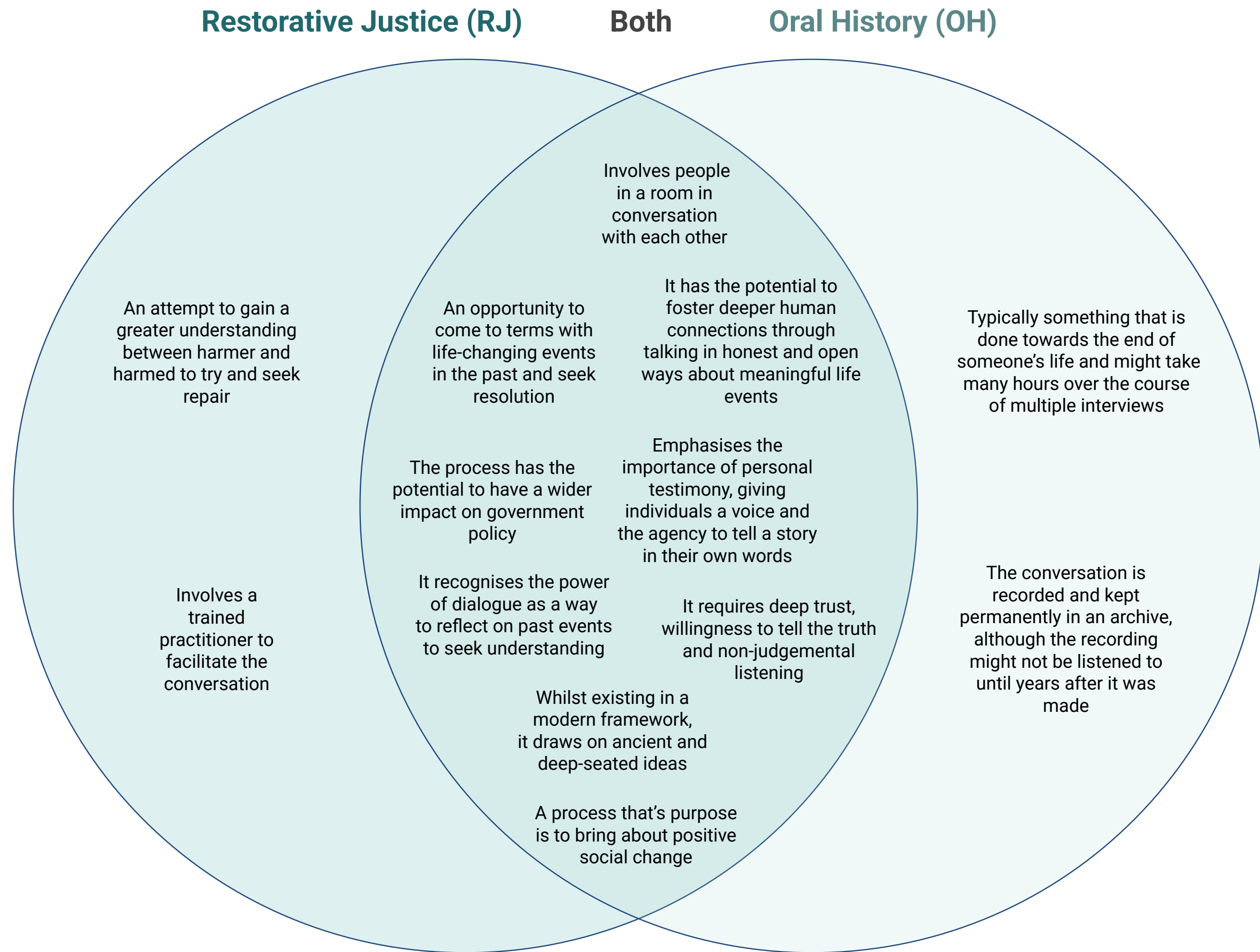
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Restorative Justice (RJ)

Ray and Vi Donovan

In 2001, Ray and Vi's 18 year old son Christopher was murdered. Eleven years later, they took part in a restorative justice process and talked to one of the young men who had killed their son.



Nick Dawson

In 1998, Nick's identical twin brother Simon was murdered, just after his 30th birthday. In 2015, Nick took part in a restorative justice process and met with one of the men who had killed his brother



Khamran Uddin

In 2012, Khamran served a custodial sentence for a violent and unprovoked attack. In 2017, he met the man he had harmed in a face to face meeting.
